Reconciling in Christ (RIC)

Our Northeastern Minnesota Synod has been working through the process toward becoming a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Synod. Delegates, Doug Halvorson and Karen Gabriel, will be voting on the following resolution at the up-coming Synod Assembly on May 3 and 4.

The resolution states:

The Northeastern Minnesota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is committed to the inclusive hospitality of God which welcomes all people into the work of the church to proclaim Christ, serve the neighbor, and strive for justice and peace in the world. We embody this hospitality in our life together as synod through unapologetic welcome and affirmation of people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and expressions, races and ethnicities, ages and abilities, and social-economic or citizenship statuses. We embrace the calling to work for welcome and reconciliation through our commitment to anti-racism and inclusion.

So what does it mean if the Northeastern Minnesota Synod becomes a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) synod?

In short: nothing changes for Faith Lutheran. The synod's decision to adopt a Welcome Statement and pursue RIC status reflects a public commitment made at the synod level—it is *not* binding on individual congregations. We are not automatically enrolled in the RIC program, nor are we required to adopt any specific statement or practice.

If Faith Lutheran were ever to consider becoming RIC, it would be a separate, congregational process that would begin with deep listening, learning, and dialogue. It would involve opportunities for education, discussion, and discernment—and ultimately, it would require a vote by the congregation.

We recognize that people in our congregation hold a variety of views on this topic. That diversity of thought is part of what makes our faith community strong. Our commitment is to continue walking together in love and respect, trusting that the Holy Spirit meets us in our questions, our conversations, and our care for one another.

What is RIC?

RIC stands for Reconciling in Christ, a designation offered by *ReconcilingWorks*, a Lutheran organization that works to promote the full inclusion of LGBTQIA+ people in the life of the church.

Congregations, ministries, and synods that become RIC commit to publicly and intentionally welcoming people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions. But the welcome doesn't stop there—RIC also includes a commitment to racial equity, accessibility for people of all abilities, and a broader vision of justice and inclusion in the life of the church.

Becoming RIC is not a one-size-fits-all process. It involves deep listening, education, relationship-building, and reflection on how our words and actions reflect the Gospel. For many churches and synods, the journey begins with crafting a *Welcome Statement* that explicitly names who is welcome—and why.

At its heart, RIC is about creating church communities where *everyone*—especially those who have historically felt excluded—can trust that they belong, are seen, and are loved as they are.

What does this resolution mean for the Northeastern Minnesota Synod?

Adopting a Welcome Statement and pursuing a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) designation is not just about adding a label—it's about deepening our identity as the Body of Christ in Northeastern Minnesota.

For our synod, this means making a clear, public commitment to welcome and affirm all people, especially those who have often felt unwelcome or unseen in church spaces—particularly our LGBTQIA+ siblings, people of color, individuals with disabilities, and others who have experienced exclusion. It's about living into the Gospel call to love boldly, to listen deeply, and to stand with those on the margins.

If the resolution passes, the synod will continue walking a path of education, relationship-building, and spiritual growth. This includes engaging congregations in conversation, offering resources for learning, and cultivating a culture where every person can trust that they belong and are beloved.

This does not mean every congregation is required to become RIC. Each community continues to discern its own journey. But as a synod, we are saying clearly: everyone is created in God's image, and everyone deserves to hear the good news of Jesus' love in a place where they are fully welcomed and affirmed.

What does this mean for Faith Lutheran Church?

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) is often described as a "big tent" church—a community where people with a wide variety of theological, political, and cultural perspectives are welcomed and held together by God's grace. We take seriously the image from 1 Corinthians 12 that we are *one body with many parts*: diverse, yet united in Christ.

The ELCA is made up of three expressions—congregations, synods, and the churchwide organization—each with its own responsibilities and authority, yet all working interdependently to support the mission of the church. While we collaborate across these expressions, congregations like Faith Lutheran remain self-governing. We call our own pastors, elect our own councils, manage our own ministry, and discern our own direction.

That said, all ELCA congregations do agree to some core principles of structure and governance that help us walk together as a church. For example, every congregation follows a shared process for calling or ending the call of a pastor, in coordination with the synod. Congregations are expected to have a church council, including an executive committee, to oversee governance and ministry leadership. Membership is handled in similar ways across the ELCA, with common practices around baptism, confirmation, transfer, and active participation. In addition, congregations follow consistent approaches to financial reporting, constitutional guidelines, and maintaining a relationship with the wider church. These shared structures create stability, accountability, and a sense of belonging to something larger than ourselves, while still allowing each congregation to reflect its own unique context and culture.

You might be wondering, If nothing is changing at Faith, why are we talking about this at all?

That's a fair question—and an important one.

Our congregational leadership believes that transparency, communication, and participation matter. As members of the Northeastern Minnesota Synod, we have the opportunity to be part of important conversations happening in the wider church. This includes hearing what is being proposed at the synod level, offering feedback from our own local context, and making sure our voices are part of the discernment process.

We didn't want this resolution to be something that's voted on "out there" without you knowing it's happening. We don't want decisions made in isolation—or surprises down

the road. Instead, we believe in being open and honest about the work our synod is engaging in, even when that work doesn't directly change our life together here at Faith.

There is one more opportunity for anyone who wants to hear more, learn more, and offer feedback, to attend an RIC workshop at Synod Assembly on Saturday, May 3rd at Breezy Point Resort. These workshops are open to all—not just voting members—and are designed to create space for honest conversation and shared understanding. A specific time for the workshop has not yet been announced, but we will share that information as soon as it becomes available.

If you have thoughts, questions, or feedback, we encourage you to reach out to our synod assembly voting members, Karen Gabriel and Doug Halvorson. They will be representing Faith at the assembly and would be glad to hear your perspective as they prepare for those conversations.
