Water and Prayer

Water is used throughout the Bible to refer to God and his way to refresh and cleanse us. And it is with prayer that God has given us a way to communicate with him.

Water is at our very core. Over two thirds of our body is water and about three fourths of the earth's surface is covered with water. God created all living things with a need for water to live.

Prayer is the way we can communicate with God. Just as water is necessary to sustain life, so it is with prayer. Prayer is our connection to God, looking to him to lead and guide our lives. Our prayers can be like dew or a gentle rain in the lives of people we care about and they can be like cool, clear, refreshing water that cleanses, heals and energizes lives. Prayer can bring changes to our local and national leaders, helping them to speak words that fall like cleansing rain on our broken country. Our prayers can bring God's living water to those who are lost and they can help wash away our own loneliness and feelings of despair or helplessness. As it says in Psalm 23, ... "he will bring us with him through green pastures and beside quiet waters. He restores our soul.." God is there for us, restoring us in this crazy, busy, and draining world.

All creation takes on new life with ample rain and moisture. And, It is in the water of our baptism, we were given a new life in Christ. So, with the summer rains, or when you are by lakes and rivers, or whenever you are using water for drinking, cooking, bathing; make the sign of the cross and let it be a reminder of your own baptism. of God's presence in your life, and for all he provides for you. Then, offer up a prayer asking God's help in protecting and preserving this valuable resource. Give God thanks for your own baptism, for the resource of water, and for his great love for you, your family, friends, and for all of his creation.

Water is a symbol of divine life, grace, new birth, growth, power, deliverance, cleansing and the covenant of our baptism.
